Singapore Maritime Foundation leads 13-company delegation to showcase Singapore's maritime capabilities at international maritime event, *Nor-Shipping*, in Norway

Mr Raymond Lim, Minister for Transport and Second Minister for Foreign Affairs will officiate the opening of the Singapore Pavilion and host the Singapore Nite@Nor-Shipping, a networking function for Singapore maritime players and the Norwegian maritime leaders.

Singapore, 4 June 2009, Thursday – Despite the economic downturn, the Singapore Maritime Foundation is set to fly the Singapore flag high at one of the major maritime event, *Nor-Shipping*. Held from June 9 – 12, 2009 in Oslo, Norway, this is the largest show of Singapore maritime's force at an overseas maritime tradeshow.

Minister for Transport and Second Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr Raymond Lim will be leading the Singapore delegation to Norway and will officiate at the opening of the Singapore Pavilion.

The Singapore Pavilion is organised by the Singapore Maritime Foundation (SMF) and its co-organiser, Association of Singapore Marine Industries (ASMI) and supported by the Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore and IE Singapore. Minister Lim will officiate the opening of the Singapore Pavilion on 9 June 2009.

On 10 June 2009, the Minister will grace the *Singapore Nite@Nor-Shipping* held at the Radisson SAS Plaza Hotel as the Guest-of-Honour. This function is organised by the Singapore Maritime Foundation to allow the Singapore partners to meet the key players of the Norwegian maritime community. Over 300 senior maritime leaders from Norway and Asia are expected to be at this event.

“The Singapore maritime sector is one of the pillars of the Singapore maritime industry. It is critical for Singapore to remain on the radar of the global maritime community, to position ourselves as a leading maritime centre and their gateway to Asia and the world. We are confident that the Singapore maritime scene will become even more important when the world economy recovers as the sphere of shipping influence moves from the West to the East,” said Mr David Chin, Executive Director of the Singapore Maritime Foundation.

The Singapore delegation consists of key representatives from the Singapore Maritime Foundation and the Association of Singapore Marine Industries, the Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore, the Ministry of Transport and 13 participating Singapore maritime companies of the Singapore Pavilion. These participating companies cover various sectors of the Singapore maritime clusters, such as ship building and ship repair, FPSO conversion and rig building, marine supply and safety solutions.
