FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S DESK

In January, we saw over 250 of our maritime partners gather at the annual SMF New Year Cocktail Reception to welcome the New Year. At the event, we bade farewell to three board members, Mr Tan Puay Hin, Ms Lisa Teo and Mr Abu Bakar, who have made excellent contributions to Maritime Singapore. We welcomed five new members to the Board, Mr Simon Kuik, Mr Ong Kim Pong, Mr Hor Weng Yew, Mr Nick Potter and Ms Caroline Yang, who are well-respected leaders in the industry.

2019 was a good year. MaritimeONE awarded 43 scholars — the highest number thus far. Out of these scholars, three are from non-maritime backgrounds, such as computer science. We are pleased to see an increasing number of such students joining the industry and raising the diversity of skills in the maritime workforce. Amongst a multitude of other SMF events, SMF and MPA launched the Circle of HR InnOvators (CHRO) network at the MSC Connexions Forum. The newly launched network comprises HR professionals from maritime companies and aims to boost the role of HR as a strategic partner in driving workforce transformation by creating a platform for dialogue and knowledge sharing.

In the months ahead, we will oversee an International Advisory Panel comprising senior industry leaders to identify strategies to tackle the decarbonisation of shipping. We will continue to work with our local and overseas partners to strengthen the community and the pipeline of talent, although as a precaution against the COVID-19 outbreak, our outreach events will be postponed until further notice.

Many thanks to our industry partners for your continued support — we look forward to more collaboration in the decade ahead.

STEERING AHEAD WITH SMF INITIATIVES



1st – 21st August 2019: MSC “BE PART OF SOMETHING BIGGER” CLAW MACHINE OUTDOOR MARKETING CAMPAIGN

Spotted a claw machine at a bus stop while walking along Dhoby Ghaut and Robinson Road? This was part of the Maritime Singapore Connect (MSC) Office’s three-week long “Be Part of Something Bigger” outdoor campaign to educate and increase the public’s awareness of the significance of the maritime industry and its career opportunities.

The public tried their hands at the claw machine, designed as a refrigerator filled with fruits and vegetables, to “grab” prizes such as limited-edition maritime-themed ez-link cards, ship-shaped thumb drives and Lego-shaped highlighters.

8th August 2019: MARITIMEONE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS CEREMONY

MaritimeONE awarded 43 scholars in 2019 — the highest number thus far. As we have been actively reaching out to students pursuing non-maritime courses to ensure a diversified talent pool, we are pleased to highlight that three of our scholars last year are from non-maritime backgrounds, including MaritimeONE’s first scholar pursuing a Bachelor of Engineering (Industrial & Systems Engineering) at the National University of Singapore (NUS).

Since the programme’s inception, a total scholarship amount exceeding S\$10 million has been awarded, paving the way for more than 380 outstanding youths to pursue courses locally and abroad.

16th August 2019: MSC MARITIME CAREERS WORKSHOP

“Some of you may not be studying maritime-related courses, but what’s great about this industry is the breadth of careers across all sectors in the maritime industry,” shared Ms Tan Beng Tee, Assistant Chief Executive (Development) of the Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore (MPA) at the fourth edition of the MSC Maritime Careers Workshop.

The event saw over 100 participants, comprising undergraduates across all disciplines, as well as professionals with less than two years of working experience.

For this run, the MSC Office partnered with six leading maritime companies — Eastern Pacific Shipping, Jurong Port, Keppel Offshore and Marine, Ocean Network Express, Sembcorp Marine and ShipsFocus Group.

Representatives from these companies shared with participants about their company cultures, positions they typically hire for and the preferred candidate profile.



23rd August, 30th August, 5th September 2019: MSC CAREER DISCOVERY PROGRAMME

The inaugural MSC Career Discovery Programme spanned across four sessions, engaging 80 undergraduates from NUS, Nanyang Technological University (NTU) and Singapore Management University (SMU), to guide them in their career exploration and how they could better position themselves to secure fulfilling careers.

Students from various disciplines benefitted from the Clifton StrengthsFinder Assessment, which identified their top five strengths. The hands-on workshops then elaborated on how these strengths could be applied in the work context. Through a deck of customised maritime career cards, participants also discovered maritime careers that would be suited for them.




6th August 2019/6th November 2019: MARITIME KNOWLEDGE SHIPPING SESSION (MKSS) 38/39

The first run of the MKSS organised by SMF and the General Insurance Association of Singapore (GIA) in 2019 focused on the topic of “The Future of Tomorrow — Strategic Changes in Singapore’s Maritime Landscape”. The second run of the MKSS focused on the topic of “Updates from International Union of Marine Insurance (IUMI) Toronto Conference 2019”.

Through the expertise of various invited speakers, participants gained deeper insights into best practices in marine insurance and how to navigate changes in an evolving maritime landscape. Participants could also pose questions to the panel to further the discussion and clarify doubts on the presented topics.

20th August 2019: SINGAPORE MARITIME DIALOGUE 2019

The 6th Singapore Maritime Dialogue (SMD), themed “Maritime Singapore in the Age of Digitalisation”, featured a panel discussion with invited speakers Mr Richard Koh, Chief Technology Officer of Microsoft Singapore, Mr John Hahn, CEO and Co-Founder of Ocean Freight Exchange and Ms Melissa Kee, Group Chief Human Resources Officer of Kuok Singapore Limited Group. The session aimed to drive deeper understanding of how maritime organisations drive connectivity, innovation and talent. A panel discussion followed thereafter, with Mr Michael Phoon, Executive Director of the Singapore Shipping Association, as the moderator. Students then posed questions to the panel to learn more about the digitalisation efforts occurring in the maritime industry.

The event was graced by Guest-of-Honour Dr Lam Pin Min, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Transport & Ministry of Health and saw an attendance of over 330 tertiary level students and teachers.





25th September 2019: **INDUSTRY WELCOME RECEPTION**

More than 100 students attended the Industry Welcome Reception, organised to welcome new graduates from both maritime and non-maritime related majors as well as offer them insights into the industry.

Mr Kenneth Chia, Executive Director of SMF, welcomed guests and introduced two speakers who are also Maritime Ambassadors — Mr Wong Hong Lee, Managing Director of Sovereign Shipping Global Pte Ltd and Chief Executive Officer of Claritecs Pte Ltd and Ms Ratna Tripathi, Operations Executive at Island View Shipping, a division of Grindrod Shipping Pte Ltd.

The speakers shared about their maritime journeys, lessons they have learnt along the way, as well as tips to keep abreast of trends in the industry. Students then had the chance to network with various partners and company representatives to explore potential careers in the maritime industry.



9th October 2019: **MSC TALK AT WÄRTSILÄ OPEN HOUSE**

In support of our partners' initiatives, the MSC Office was invited to speak at the inaugural Wärtsilä Open House which involved a Design Thinking workshop, targeted at students from polytechnics and universities equipped with design thinking skills.

The team gave a presentation on the overview of the maritime industry before students went into groups to work on maritime problem statements using design thinking methodology. SMF endeavours to reach out to students across various backgrounds to raise awareness of the maritime industry.





17th – 29th October 2019: **MARITIME SKIT**

SMF commissioned a maritime-themed skit with the aim of educating primary and secondary school students on the multiple education and career opportunities that the maritime industry has to offer through a fun and engaging manner.

The first run of the skit was held in October 2019, reaching out to more than 1,000 primary school students within a span of two weeks.

13th November 2019: **MSC CONNEXIONS FORUM AND LAUNCH OF CIRCLE OF HR INNOVATORS (CHRO) NETWORK**

Is our local talent pool ready to meet the demands of the future?

At the fourth run of the MSC Connexions Forum held at the Sands Expo & Convention Centre, over 140 of the MSC Office's partners from maritime companies, schools, career centres, government and industry associations gathered for a time of learning and networking. The event also marked the official launch of a new initiative spearheaded by MPA and SMF — the CHRO network. This network comprises HR professionals from maritime companies across various sectors, and aims to boost the role of HR as a strategic partner in driving workforce transformation.

The programme saw keynote speaker, Ms Elsie Ng, Head of Talent Solutions — Singapore from LinkedIn, sharing insights on the interplay between digital and talent transformation as well as the new tech roles created in the maritime space. It also featured a maritime C-suite panel discussion on the topic "Driving Maritime Singapore's Digital and Workforce Transformation", which shared about the impact of technology on existing maritime roles and the challenges faced in driving digital transformation.





6th December 2019: YES CLUB YEAR END GATHERING

The annual YES Club Year End Gathering serves as a platform for YES Club members to network and stay updated with happenings in the industry. The event began with a session of games where participants came together to solve challenges in teams, followed by a casual networking session where they caught up with industry peers and met with like-minded individuals.

They highlighted the importance of HR's role in workforce transformation, and how the CHRO network can create a platform for knowledge sharing of best practices and new ideas.
